FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES, GRANTS, AND SCHEMES

NIHR Rolling Call HSDR Programme – The <u>Health and Social Care Delivery Research (HSDR) Programme</u> is accepting Stage 1 applications to this funding opportunity. The programme is interested in receiving applications to meet recommendations in research identified in NICE guidance that has been published or updated during the last 5 years. This call closes 18th March 2025. For more information follow this <u>link</u>.

UKRI Proof of Concept – The Proof of Concept funding aims to support and accelerate the development of new or improved technologies, products, processes, and services arising from research activities at eligible UK research organisations, including, universities, research institutes, facilities and centres. The UKRI Proof of Concept funding opportunity supports early-to-mid stage commercialisation activities that validate the development of concepts that arose from research. Within these grants, there is also a fourth, all year grant to involving members of the public in research up to the cost of £2,000.00 which may be used to support Public Patient Involvement. ColoCap Is Live

The ColoCap study is the largest award the Trust has received for a clinical trial and investigates the diagnostic accuracy of colon capsule endoscopy compared to traditional, more invasive colonoscopy. The study is now open to recruitment and will be run across 30 sites in England, Scotland, and Wales and is aiming to recruit 973 participants across all of the sites. The study is going to recruit individuals with suspect colorectal cancer, pre-malignant polyps, and those with colitis.



Research Toolkit

Developed with input from our Head of Research Delivery and Nursing Research, Cate Laven, the national Research Toolkit is now live. Matrons and health care leaders are central to creating environments where nurses can lead, participate in, and deliver research and innovation. This research toolkit offers practical information and resources that can help nurture research as part of day-to-day nursing practice to achieve excellence in personcentred outcomes.

Cognition in Meningioma

Meningiomas are the most common type of primary intracranial removal yet the effects of tumour removal have been poorly investigated. The Trust's Lead Consultant Clinical Psychologist, Stephen Evans, along with collaborators, have addressed this and evaluated removal of these tumours. The evaluation found significantly improved verbal fluency and some measures of working memory upon removal. You can read more about this <u>here</u>.
